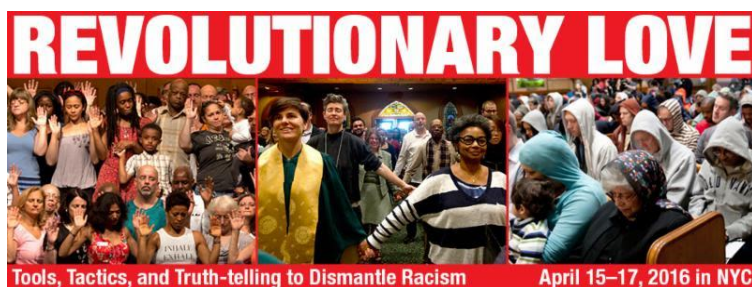
Get Ready for Thirty Days of Love!
