Happenin' @ Peter White Public Library:

The "Building Hope in Uncertain Times" series at the library continues with the film: *Five Broken Cameras* at 7 pm on Tuesday, December 8 in the Peter White Public Library Community Room

"Five Broken Cameras" is a deeply personal, first-hand account of life and non-violent resistance in the village of Bil'in, surrounded by illegal, Israeli settlements. Filmed by Palestinian farmer Emad Burnat, on his first camera beginning in 2005, the film follows his family's evolution over five years of village upheaval. As the years pass in front of the camera, Burnat watches from behind the lens as olive trees are bulldozed, protests intensify and lives are lost in this cinematic diary and unparalleled record of life in the Israeli-occupied West Bank.

Released in 2011, the 90 minute documentary received a 2012 Academy Award nomination for Best Documentary Feature and numerous international film festival awards.

Barbara Michael and gg gordon will provide an introduction to the film from their experience in Palestine in 2011 and 2015 respectively.

The *Building Hope* series is based on the anthology *The Impossible Will Take a Little While: Perseverance and Hope in Troubled Times*, edited by Paul Rogat Loeb. The film/reading/discussion series offers inspiration and encouragement to create positive change within our community.
