dvd's and booklets, as well as the UU curriculum, all compliments of our Social Action Committee and UU's for Justice in the Middle East.





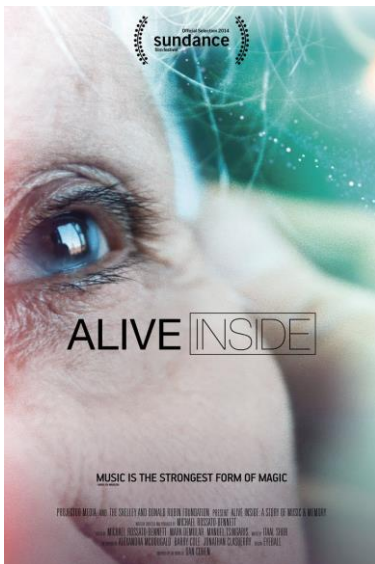
But we do try to make it easier for you.
