A Mission Statement is defined as "a written declaration of an organization's core purpose and focus that normally remains unchanged over time. Properly crafted mission statements (1) serve as filters to separate what is important from what is not, (2) clearly state which markets will be served and how, and (3) communicate a sense of intended direction to the entire organization."

Ideally a mission statement is something a congregation can insert into its order of service, say in unison at services, and use to define our organization to outsiders.

Here is the Committee's draft Mission Statement:

Committed to Building Beloved Community.

We Care for, Nurture and Support the Spiritual Growth of One Another;

We Work Together to Bend the Moral Arc of the Universe toward Justice.
