# Working Families could get thrown under the bus

Michigan House Republicans are proposing to help fix Michigan's roads by eliminating the Michigan Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC), effectively raising taxes on 820,000 low-income working families raising 1 million kids. Next Tuesday, June 2nd at 9 a.m. the House Roads and Economic Development Committee will be taking up HB 4609, a bill that would ELIMINATE the Michigan EITC. Please take one or both of these actions:

- 1. Call Committee members at the numbers below before next Tuesday.
- 2. Join MUUSJN and others at the Committee meeting at 9 a.m. Tuesday, June 2nd (room 352 in the State Capitol Bldg.) to testify against HB 4609.

The Committee is scheduled to also meet about this bill on Wednesday, June 3rd at 4 p.m. in Room 519 of the House Office Building.

### **BACKGROUND**

For many years, the Michigan League for Public Policy (MLPP) has taken leadership to protect that safety net program for Michigan's working poor. MUUSJN continues to support this position. The EITC lets working families who earn low wages or have fallen on hard times to get a tax break which allows them to keep more of what they earn to pay for their basic needs such as food, shelter and clothing.

In 2013, the average person on the Michigan's EITC received \$143, only six percent of the federal EITC which paid low income Michigan workers an average of \$2,387 in 2013. In 2011, lawmakers cut the EITC from 20% of the federal EITC to 6% to help pay for major tax cuts for businesses.

Michigan shouldn't pave its roads on the backs of the working poor. The Michigan EITC is one of the state's most effective tools for reducing poverty and for building economic security. The \$117 million that would be saved by eliminating the credit is a drop in the \$1 billion+ transportation plan but would have have a huge impact on families who struggling to make ends meet.

### **TELL THEM:**

- 1. I'm angry that the Michigan House would propose a bill to pave our roads on the backs of low-income working families;
- 2. If lawmakers eliminate the Michigan EITC it would be second time in five years that they have raised taxes on low-income working families even as Michigan families continue to struggle to struggle;
- 3. People of faith believe that lawmakers should restore the EITC credit for working families, not repeal it;
- 4. Vote NO on this outrageous bill when it comes before the Roads and Economic Development Committee.

One Suggested Vision ~ The Visual: A "Field of Dreams", a collective effort to beautify the field at the far end of the parking lot of the MqtUU property. The Idea: The field can be sectioned into 6' x 9' sections with a common walkway of mulch or other material. Each section can be claimed by an individual, family, committee or possibly community group and designed with their own unique flair. Suggestions shown in the graph. There may be a few restrictions being, any plants planted in the ground must be local, native plants and maintenance, including weeding and watering is the responsibility of the group stewarding that section.
