**This service will be held at the Pavilion at Presque Isle Park, with a potluck to follow. Please bring a dish to share.**



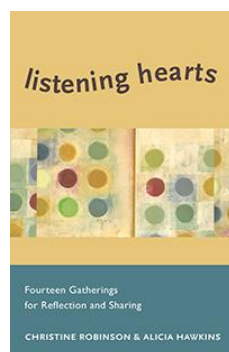
**All are Welcome to join UP RAINBOW PRIDE in the July 4<sup>th</sup> Parade!**
