# July 31 Adult Forum Hosted by Sarah Redmond

Rev. Pinkney was convicted by an all white jury of tampering with re-call petitions with no evidence and sentenced to 2 to 10 years. Since 1999 he's been court watching and organizing against the takeover of this black community by the state of Michigan with the first emergency manager. The city had a prime piece of property on Lake Michigan as a park. The EM sold the park to a private corporation for a PGA golf course and luxury housing development. The re-call petition was to recall the mayor who rubber stamped the sale.

The power structure has harassed Rev. P to the point of imprisoning him for writing an article quoting scripture they felt was threatening. The array of people who've come to his defense has been amazing. They've shipped him to Marquette to get him out of the limelight and away from access by his family and supporters. I'm visiting as is one other person, plus gg is putting in her application to visit him. His case is on appeal to the MI Sup. Ct. but no ruling as yet.
