

Special thanks to the six members of the Michigan Board of Education who voted this afternoon [Wednesday] to adopt new LGBTO Guidelines for Michigan schools. The purpose of these guidelines is to help teachers and administrators create safer learning environments for all students in Michigan schools, regardless of their sexual orientation. LGBTQ students have been suffering higher rates of drop-outs and suicides due to bullying, harassment and violence in our schools. Forty-seven people, including MUUSJN Board member Norma Bailey, testified in favor of the guidelines. Thirty-one spoke in opposition to the guidelines, which were softened from ones presented earlier this summer by a more hostile crowd. To continue support of the guidelines,

contact your school officials and urge them to adopt the new LGBTQ guidelines, remembering the worth and dignity of every person.
