The **National Museum of African American History and Culture** will be opening this Saturday. The museum, part of the Smithsonian, is 100 years in the making, as the idea was first proposed in 1915 by black veterans who fought in the Civil War. The museum is 400,000 square feet and is located on the National Mall near the Washington Monument.

“The majority of the exhibition space is underground. On the bottom level, museum-goers will find themselves in literal and metaphorical darkness: slavery. Then, as they ascend, visitors move through exhibits exploring the Jim Crow era and the civil rights movement, until finally reaching light and joy - above-ground galleries devoted to culture, music, dance, literature.” ~ via NPR
